Re: Background for the April 25th meeting @ 1:00 pm – City Services Center

ACTION ITEMS:

Items A & B. Proposals for the annual Median Mowing and Noxious Weed & Rank Growth were due on April 21st and only two companies offered their services. The Proposal Tabulations are included in the packet. Staff is recommending award of each of the Proposals to the respective “low bidders”.

Item C. This is a topic that staff has been periodically discussed and there is a general consensus that the Water Utility should be compensated water that is used for firefighting purposes outside of the City limits. MATC has hosted a couple of driver operator training classes in the City over the past year and the participants practice pumping water from the City’s hydrants. Staff compares that type of use to be very similar to the customers that purchase bulk water from the Utility and believes the Utility should be compensated for the water used during any such training class.

Item D. The Committee Chairman has requested the Committee’s support for the attached No-Mow May resolution in the packet.

Item E. This is the standing agenda item to review and approve monthly utility billing adjustments. The adjustments for February 2022 are included in the packet.

Minutes of the Public Safety Committee Meeting – February 28, 2022

Members Present: Phil Wedekind, Tom Kolb and Mike Plautz. **Others Present:** Tom Pinion, Tony Gilman, Wade Peterson.

Call to Order - Committee Tom Kolb called the meeting to order at 1:00 P.M. at Baraboo City Service Center. Compliance with the Open Meeting Law was noted. It was moved by Wedekind, seconded by Plautz to approve the agenda as posted. Motion carried unanimously. It was moved by Wedekind, seconded by Plautz to approve the minutes of the January 31, 2022 meeting. Motion carried unanimously.

Public Invited To Speak (*Any citizen has the right to speak on any item of business that is on the agenda for this meeting if recognized by the presiding officer.*) – There were no speakers.

Action Items

- a. Review 2022 Public Works Projects Bid Tabulation and recommend award of contract – Pinion present bid results to the Committee. He said prices are higher this year for paving due to the price of oil. Curb and Gutter and Sidewalk prices are up considerably from last year; therefore, we will be able to do less concrete than previous years, unless we starting picking some stuff up in house. It was moved by Wedekind, seconded by Plautz to recommend awarding contracts to all low bidders. Motion carried unanimously.
- b. Review and approval of monthly Billing Adjustments/Credit for Sewer and Water Customers for the month of February 2022 – It was moved by Wedekind, seconded by Plautz to approve the monthly Billing Adjustments/Credits for February 2022. Motion carried unanimously.

Information Items

- a. Electric Vehicle Charging Stations for on-street parking stalls in downtown Baraboo – Pinion stated that he received an inquiry from Brothers On Oak, they are contemplating putting in an electric vehicle charging station in front of their establishment. He said there are a couple of public charging stations in Baraboo. He said that the DOT no longer makes it public access to the number of electric vehicles registered, three years ago there were six in Sauk County. He said there has not been too big of a demand; Alliant has one on Commerce Avenue and possible Kwik Trip. He said that DBI and BID have talked about it. He said that the last two or three parking lots that have been done conduit to add them at some point in the future was installed. Kolb likes the idea of having charging stations, but not on public streets.

Reports

- a. Utility Superintendent's Report
 - i. Staffing Updates – No report.
 - ii. Project Updates – Peterson said that no new updates with West Baraboo Agreement. He said that he has not heard any more from the DNR regarding private lead services. Peterson said that the City has signed up for the free PFAS testing offered by the State. Peterson said that the R/R trestle at 1055 Lake Street will be refurbished in 2022 and will require the removal of the sewer line. He said the Water Utility has been working with the Wisconsin Rural Water Association on creating a plan to protect the areas around our wells. We are nearing completion of the plan and will bring it forward for adoption and ordinance change.
- b. Street Superintendent's Report
 - i. Staffing Updates – Gilman said after the application/interview process, it was decided not to fill the open DPW position at this time. He said that a staggered start time to minimize the amount of staff in a certain area at one time is still in place.
 - ii. Project Updates – Gilman discussed he vehicle and equipment tracking for plow trucks and sweepers. This equipment can track miles driven, total miles sander is activated, amount of liquid brine distributed, and the amount of salt or salt/sand distributed. The equipment can also be setup to work with street sweepers. Gilman said once programmed to a street sweeper, it will track miles driven, miles swept when broom is activated, and how many loads were hauled per day. He said that this date is useful for annual MS4 reporting. He said that they are also considering similar units for the refuse and recycling trucks but those would be permanent fixtures. Gilman said the units in refuse and garbage trucks would be linked to a tablet that would have certain options to select so the drivers could drop pins, noting concerns, such as potholes, low hanging limbs, carts not out for pickup, etc. Pinion said that the benefit would far exceed the expense. Kolb asked Gilman for cost of units, including fees, and software updates.

- iii. Monthly Report on Public Works Department activities – Gilman said the mild, but windy, winter has reduced the amount of hours committed to snow removal, and the quantity of materials used to combat the winter weather, except for the storm last Tuesday. He said that the crew continues to help Parks with tree removal. Gilman said that the crew continues to pick up brush curbside as requests come in. He said the requests are few during the winter months. He said he would continue to evaluate the brush site closure.

- c. Police Chief's Report
 - i. Staffing Updates – No report.
 - ii. Case/Response Update – All reports included in the packet.

- d. Fire Chief's Report
 - i. Monthly Incident Report – Report was included in Council packet.
 - ii. Operations Study Update – The EMS Commission did approve adopting the resolution to go ahead with the covenants and then participating in the strategic plan. He said they did not choose anyone for the AdHoc Committee, which will be in March.
 - iii. Fire & EMS Facility Design Update – Stieve said the mandatory pre-proposal meeting in on March 2 at 10:30 a.m.
 - iv. Staffing updates – Stieve said that two were hired in January, and there is one that is going through the last phase of the process.

AJOURNMENT – It was moved by Wedekind, seconded by Plautz to adjourn at 1:32 p.m. Motion carried.

The City of Baraboo, Wisconsin

Background: “No-Mow May” is a growing trend among Wisconsin municipalities, designed to provide food sources to bees and other pollinators during the month of May, when they are particularly vulnerable. Even low-growing flowers commonly found in lawns, such as violets, dandelions, and clover can provide important habitat and food sources. Under this proposal, residents and City staff would be encouraged to reduce lawn-mowing practices and support pollinator populations during May, and enforcement of vegetative height restrictions would be suspended.

Resolved by the Common Council of the City of Baraboo, Sauk County, Wisconsin:

WHEREAS, pollinator species such as bees, flies, moths, butterflies, beetles, and select birds provide essential pollination services for food plants that humans depend on for survival; and

WHEREAS, pollinator populations are in decline regionally and world-wide; and

WHEREAS, early spring flowers, including those found in many lawns, can provide an important food source for bees and other pollinators as they emerge from hibernation; and

WHEREAS, dozens of Wisconsin cities, including Appleton, La Crosse, Wausau, Stevens Point, Fort Atkinson, Verona, and Sun Prairie currently participate in the “No-Mow May” science initiative to encourage property owners to limit their lawn mowing practices during the month of May;

WHEREAS, research by Lawrence University has shown that such practices can result in a three-fold increase in bee species richness and a five-fold increase in bee abundance; and

WHEREAS, the Baraboo Parks and Recreation Department has started replacing mowed turfgrass with native pollinator (no mow) areas in many of its parks, which has allowed the city to increase parklands without adding staff as well as cutting capital equipment, maintenance, and gas costs;

NOW, BE IT THEREFORE RESOLVED, that the City of Baraboo recognizes “No-Mow May” to actively promote and educate the community about the critical period of pollinator emergence, generation of pollinator-supporting habitat, and early spring foraging opportunities; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the City of Baraboo shall encourage the cultivation of food sources for bees and other pollinators by suspending enforcement of height restrictions for vegetative growth contained in Chapter 10 of the Municipal Code during the month of May, 2022; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, the growth of certain species defined as Noxious Weeds in 10.03(8) shall continue to be prohibited

West Baraboo Agreements – Still no progress

Reports:

Public Fire Protection – The City Administrator has inquired about moving all the Public Fire Protection fees to the Utility bills. Presently the city pays \$289,000 of the fee and \$312,000 is paid for by the utility customers. A memo is attached that was submitted to the Finance committee.

Private lead service grant – We were awarded \$162,500. Our plan is for the utility/local plumber will complete 15 services. Something new this year, we plan to put a project together for a contractor to complete 16 services. This will require hiring an engineering firm to assist with bidding the project and tracking/submitting the Davis-Bacon rules. We are still inventorying services, so we have not completed our list of 16 services. The plan is to have the list and advertise for project by the end of May.

Utility Audit – The auditor was here, all data looked good so far. Jan and Kelly did a great job putting the data together!!

Cleaning/Inspection Birch Reservoir and Commerce Tower – We will be completing this project in early May.

Rehabilitation of Hwy A water tower – The scheduling for this project is not coming together very well. Contractor planned on starting in May. US Cellular will not be able to get equipment off the tower until mid-June. They are awaiting FAA approval for the installation of the temporary tower.

Televising Sanitary Sewer lines – We are scheduled to televise 22 miles of sewer lines this year. This project will start in mid-May. Our sewer crew is out cleaning the lines in preparation of this project.

R/R bridge (Trussell at 1055 Lake St) – Earlier this week we were contacted by a R/R consultant for Wisconsin Southern. There are plans to refurbish/upgrade the trussell in 2022. In 1962 the Sewer Utility signed an agreement to install a sanitary sewer line thru the trussell. They are stating that we must remove the sewer line during the refurbishing project and there is a possibility that we may not be able to reinstall the line after the completion of the project. This will be a significant issue for us. We will start evaluating our

options. Secondly, the trussell is now owned by the DOT. So if we need to reconstructed (and we will need to) the sewer line thru the trussell, we will have to complete a lengthy agreement with the DOT.

Wellhead Protection Plan – The Water Utility has been working with the Wisconsin Rural Water Association on creating a plan to protect the areas around our five wells. The plan has been submitted to the DNR for approval. Once that is completed, we will present plan to committee and council for approval.



Summary of Public Fire Protection Charge (PFP)

Background (from the Public Service Commission’s website):

The PFP charge recovers the cost of providing water for fighting fires and the extra capacity built into the system that is necessary to rapidly deliver a large volume of water to a fire anywhere within the municipality's water service area. These costs include a portion of the wells, pumps, storage facilities, water mains, hydrants and an estimated quantity of water used for this purpose.

The municipality has three options for recovering the PFP charge.

1. Charges for PFP can be included on the water bills of utility customers (and non-customers) as allowed by Wis. Stat. § 196.03(3)(b). This method is referred to as a direct charge. Advantages to this method are that it does not increase property taxes, tax exempt water customers contribute to the system, and charges do not count against the municipality's levy limit. Disadvantages include the fact that the PFP charge cannot be deducted on individuals' income taxes, and the amount of the charge to a particular customer is not strictly related to the benefit received. (*Direct Charge - DC*)

2. The municipality can pay the PFP charge and recover it through property taxes. This is referred to as a municipal charge. Advantages of this method are that the water bill is smaller, the PFP is deductible on individual income taxes, and all properties except those that are tax exempt pay for the PFP. While the charge is paid proportionate to benefits received, the PFP charge counts towards the municipality’s levy limit. (*Municipal Charge - MC*)

3. The municipality can elect to pay a portion of the PFP charge with the balance being made up through direct charges to customers. (*Combined Charge - CC*)

The PFP in Baraboo is currently a Combined Charge, with the City contributing \$289,307 of the total PFP. Since the City is considering moving their portion of the Combined Charge to the Utility's side of the ledger, the estimated resulting impact to the customers' rates was requested.

For estimating purposes, the Public Service Commission's existing rate structure was used to project the impact to customers. The existing rate structure could be modified as part of the PSC's review and approval of this change.

Miscellaneous Facts and Figures:

- Since the Water Utility is regulated by the Wisconsin Public Service Commission, an annual Payment In Lieu of Taxes (PILOT) is required. The PILOT makes the Utility the 4th highest “taxpayer” in Baraboo. The 2021 PILOT was \$344,330; for reference, in 2010, it was \$230,000.
- A percentage of the City Engineer’s Salary: In 2010, the Utility was first “charged” \$21,500, which has increased incrementally each year.
- City collection fees: The Utility is charged \$10,000 per year for processing Utility payments.
- City Attorney fees: The Utility is charged \$2,500 per year for the City Attorney’s services.
- A portion of the City Administrator’s Salary: In 2021, the Utility was first charged \$2,000.

Pending Capital Projects:

- 2022 – The County Hwy A water tower rehabilitation project will raise the Water Utility’s PILOT by an estimated \$10,000.
- 2022 - The water main installation for the development of the former Jackson Farm property will raise the Water Utility’s PILOT by an estimated \$22,000.
- 2024 – The water main improvements that will be part of the State Hwy 33 reconstruction project will raise the Water Utility’s PILOT by an estimated \$22,000.

If the City decided to proceed with moving the \$289,307 from the General Fund to the Water Utility, it will require a Rate Case Application to the PSC. That application should be submitted no later than July so the resulting new rates could take effect January 1, 2023. The estimated cost of the Application is \$5,000 to \$10,000, which the Utility respectfully requests be paid by the City.



APRIL 2022 STREET DEPARTMENT STATUS REPORT

Staffing/Scheduling Updates

- As of 3/14, all DPW staff has been operating on a 7:00am – 3:00pm Monday thru Friday work schedule. As mentioned previously, certain tasks upcoming will moved to a 6:00am – 4:00pm Monday thru Thursday schedule so we have the opportunity to utilize the machinery on Friday as well and see a 48-hour week for select tasks.

Activity Report

- **Plowing/ Salting/ Sanding:** Intend to be done with plowing/removal of snow for the season.... But not holding my breath. It's been a weird spring!
- **Tree/Stump Removals:** Scheduled tree removals have been completed. DPW crew is now grinding, cleaning out, and topsoiling the 350+ stumps.
- **Leaf Collection:** Leaf collection has begun and the crew is working their way through the city. Our 2022 budgeted leaf vac was originally scheduled to arrive the first week of April but is now delayed until 4/29 (we hope). Like many manufacturers of vehicles and equipment, "chips" have caused the holdup in production.
- **Utility Repairs:** As with previous years, DPW has been helping the Utilities with the replacement of concrete related to water breaks from the past winter. Once concrete has cured, we will also help prepare the break areas for paving by Gasser Construction (winning bidder for paving in 2022)

Project Updates

- **Equipment/Vehicle/Materials Tracking Capabilities:** Nothing new to report. Travis (DPW Mechanic) and I will be meeting with a Preclice representative again to determine a cost more specific to our needs. As a reminder, Preclice manufactures a calibration system that can monitor the amount of sand/salt/brine applied during winter and also the miles drive and time idle. They system is also compatible with street sweepers to monitor debris collection, miles swept, and total miles driven. The system is also compatible with refuse/recycling trucks, and when paired with a tablet, allows a pin to be dropped to track locations of potholes, low limbs, carts not set out, cart violations, etc.

Informational items

- **Future Budget:** In an effort to further reduce costs without a loss of services, we have been discussing methods to improve efficiency. Several tasks are being evaluated including brush collection methods/disposal practices, refuse/recycling collection, and snow plowing/removal.

- Brush collection will be further evaluated to determine the most cost effective manner of which brush is collected and disposed of. With rising fuel prices are we better served with the site open for residents for drop-off along with still providing our curbside pickup? That is TBD.
- We will be sending out a Request for Proposals related to refuse and recycling collection. I was unable to locate any history indicating the City sought proposals for contracted disposal in the past, and feel we wouldn't be doing our "due diligence" if we did not seek proposals to determine if utilizing staff is the most cost effective means of providing the service, or if there is savings to be had by utilizing an outside refuse/recycling contractor. In speaking with other municipalities, many of which elected to contract refuse/recycling services, some have found brush and/or yard waste disposal to be more cost effective when managed by the refuse/recycling contractor servicing their community. That will also be a consideration in the RFP.
- We will be evaluating plow routes to determine the most efficient means of accomplishing the routes. Can they be re-configured to reduce "overlap" of routes, are we using the most efficient equipment possible to plow the routes, and are we using the least amount of material for de-icing/traction control so as to provide the level of safety needed, in the most cost effective manner. Based on the age of our fleet and equipment, I anticipate this will be a substantial cost to begin and will provide an estimate on ROI when a final estimate is given on equipment upgrades.
- **600 Block of Ash Street Parking:** This area has been discussed in the past regarding the 4 Hour parking restriction. The situation is that the north half of the 600 block has a 4 Hour Parking limit by ordinance. The south half of the block is No Parking anytime due to Fire Department needing space for the vehicle exit and entry of their facility. Primarily during the winter months, we have experienced vehicles parked in the 4 Hour Parking area for periods of time extending beyond 4 Hours. This often prevents us the opportunity to plow/remove snow in that area. Being in such close proximity to the Fire Department vehicle exit/entrance, and with designated Fire responder parking on the west side of Ash, this creates a narrowing of Ash Street for emergency vehicles traveling north on Ash. As a recommendation based on our plowing/snow removal experiences, I would recommend that Ash Street parking be prohibited from 2:00am – 6:00am as it is on both Oak Street and Broadway. That 4 hour window would provide ample opportunity for us to safely plow and remove snow in the 600 block, allowing that stretch of Ash to remain as wide and passable as possible. I believe this would pose minimal inconvenience to residents residing in the 600 block seeing as there is a 24 Hour Municipal Parking Lot at the southwest corner of Ash Street and 5th Street.
