ACTION ITEMS:

Items A. Please refer to the attached Resolution in the Agenda Packet. Bids were opened on Wednesday, July 20th and there was only one Bid submitted. Wade checked their references and we are recommending the contract be awarded to the Low Bidder, Mid-City Corporation, from Butler, WI.

Item B. The City has received word that we are the recipient of another grant from the Local Road Improvement Program's (LRIP) Municipal Street Improvement Program. Baraboo was one of several grantees again this year. The total amount available for this biennium for communities in Sauk County \$105,000. Equal portions of this amount was awarded to the seven communities that applied, with each receiving \$15,000. This money was approved for Oak Street reconstruction project, between 15th & Madison.

Item C. The municipal parking lot behind the Fire Department has reserved stalls designated for the Fire Department and BDAS since both organizations are "inhabiting" the FD building. The reserved parking is designed by Ordinance and I have included a proposed Ordinance Amendment in the packet for your consideration.

Item F. This is the standing agenda item to review and approve monthly utility billing adjustments. The adjustments for June 2022 are included in the packet.

Minutes of the Public Safety Committee Meeting – June 27, 2022

Members Present: Phil Wedekind, Tom Kolb and John Ellington. **Others Present:** Lt. Ryan Labroschian, Tom Pinion, Tony Gilman, Wade Peterson, Heather Kierzek, Jeff Spencer, and Kris Denzer.

Call to Order - Committee Tom Kolb called the meeting to order at 1:00 P.M. at Baraboo City Service Center. Compliance with the Open Meeting Law was noted. It was moved by Wedekind, seconded by Ellington to approve the agenda as posted. Motion carried unanimously. It was moved by Ellington, seconded by Wedekind to approve the minutes of the May 23, 2022 meeting. Motion carried.

Public Invited To Speak (*Any citizen has the right to speak on any item of business that is on the agenda for this meeting if recognized by the presiding officer.*) – There were no speakers.

Action Items

- a. Review and recommend approval of the WRRF’s 2021 Compliance Maintenance Annual Report – The Utility again did a fantastic job, with a great Annual Report. It was moved by Ellington, seconded by Wedekind to approve the WRRF’s 2021 Compliance Maintenance Annual Report as presented. Motion carried unanimously.
- b. Review and recommend approval of a draft Well Head Protection Ordinance – Peterson presented the background. He said that the DNR has signed off on it. He said that it is adding some language to our Ordinance. He said that it protects the area around each well. It was moved by Wedekind, seconded by Ellington to recommend approval of the Well Head Protection Ordinance as presented. Motion carried unanimously.
- c. Review and recommend reducing the speed limit on CTH T (Taft Avenue) from Man Mound Road to 12th Street from 45 mph to 35 mph – Pinion presented the background to the Committee. He said Alderperson Kierzek has received a number of requests to reduce the speed limit, and Interim Police Chief Sinden would support reducing the speed limit 100%. It was moved by Ellington, seconded by Wedekind to recommend reducing the speed limit on CTH T (Taft Avenue) from Man Mound Road to 12th Street from 45 mph to 35 mph. Motion carried unanimously.
- d. Revise and recommend a parking restriction on the west side of Jefferson Street, south of 14th Street – Pinion said staff received a complaint about parking on the west side of Jefferson Street, along Dental Associates office Building, citing concerns about the lack of visibility of northbound traffic on Jefferson from eastbound traffic on 14th Street. He then said that he stumbled across a provision in the Ordinance that allows angle parking on the east side of Jefferson Street, 98’ south of 14th Street. Pinion felt the few vehicles that would be inconvenienced with eliminating the parking would be able to park in the parking lot across 14th Street. Kolb said that there is also the issue of angle parking on the east side of Jefferson Street, 14th to point 98’ south. He also said that between 11th Street and a point 150’ feet north of 11th Street should be kept; however, the stalls need to be striped. Kolb then said that angle parking is allowed between 8th Street and a point 117 feet south of 8th Street, he feels this should be eliminated. The Committee agreed. It was moved by Wedekind, seconded by Ellington to recommend to eliminate parking on the west side of Jefferson Street, south of 14th Street to 12th Street, east side of Jefferson Street between 14th Street and a point 98 feet south of 14th Street, and on Jefferson Street between 8th Street and a point 117 feet south of 8th Street. Motion carried unanimously.
- e. Review and recommend removing the angle parking provision from Section 7.09(2)(k) for the east side of Jefferson Street, south of 14th Street – Motion was made along with Item B.
- f. Review and approval of monthly Billing Adjustments/Credits for Sewer and Water Customers for April – It was moved by Ellington, seconded by Wedekind to approve monthly adjustments as presented. Motion carried unanimously.

Information Items – None

Reports

- a. Utility Superintendent's Report
 - i. Staffing Updates – No report.
 - ii. Project Updates – Peterson said that the language has been agreed on for West Baraboo Agreement and should be finalized soon. He said that four of the 15 lead services are complete. Peterson said that the last of biosolids has been spread, one farmer wanted to wait until he cut his first crop hay. Crew has completed 95% of this year's sewer cleaning. He said that they have run into some issues with broken pipes. He said the contractor for sewer main lining has completed what was scheduled for this year. Two lines on 11th Street were addressed. Peterson said that the contractor has completed about 60% of the television and several mains were discovered that need urgent attention. He said most of the mains will be able to be addressed with our own crews, but time has not allowed. He said the old 36" concrete line on Barker needs a full replacement, Allen Steele is scheduled to complete it in mid-July. Utility crew has completed 70% of the hydrant and valve maintenance. County A tower has started, hopefully early August it will be back on-line. He said that he has been receiving a higher-than-normal number complaints about black water. The manganese level from Well #6 is high so the well was taken out of service.
- b. Street Superintendent's Report
 - i. Staffing Updates – Staffing levels remain at 14, operating with 7:00 start 5-days per week.
 - ii. Activity Report – Gilman said alley reconstruction has begun with the 2/3 Alley – Birch to West and the 2/3 alley Center to Summit. Paving is tentatively scheduled for Mid-July. Crew will move to the 5/6 Wheeler to Camp alley. Gilman said that Department will have a stronger involvement with the Big Top Parade. He said the Department is assisting with the remaining few utility dig restorations as needed. Brush collection was then discussed. He said that the Refuse/Recycle RFP is being worked on.
 - iii. Project Updates – No report.
- c. Interim Police Chief's Report
 - i. Staffing Updates – No change, still down two officers and one administrative assistant position.
 - ii. Case/Response Update – Labroschian said all reports were included in the packet. He said that the year-to-date, it may appear that they are down 3.5% which seems good; however, the types of cases and severity of cases being investigated are up. Labroschian said that the Circus Parade went great, the DPW was complimented.
- d. Fire Chief's Report
 - i. Monthly Incident Report – No Report

AJOURNMENT – It was moved by Ellington, seconded by Wedekind to adjourn at 1:38 p.m. Motion carried.

Background: With the \$160,000 we received for the Private Lead Service Replacement Program, an estimated forty (40) services could be updated. Due to the higher number of possible replacements, the Utility plans to complete fifteen (15) services and contract for the replacement of 16 private lead services. SEH Inc developed the bid specification and advertised for bids. Bids are due July 20th @ 9:00 AM. Replacements could start as early as August 2nd and the substantial completion date is Nov 1st. Our estimate for the project was \$96,000. The additional \$20,000 will still come from the WDNR funds, but it will reduce the number of services that the Utility/local plumber will be able to complete.

Background: In October of 2020, this Ordinance was amended to provide reserved parking for the Fire Department and Baraboo District Ambulance Service in the Municipal Parking Lot at the southwest corner of 5th Street and Ash Street (located adjacent to/north of the Fire Station). To accommodate parking for their additional staff, BDAS has requested 2 additional reserved parking stalls, which will increase the total reserved for BDAS from eight to ten parking stalls.

This matter was reviewed by the Public Safety Committee at their July 25th meeting and forwarded to the Council with a recommendation to approve.

An Ordinance amending §7.09(16) relating to Reserved Parking for Officials.

THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BARABOO, WISCONSIN, DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

1. Section 7.09(16), Reserved Parking for Officials, of the Baraboo Municipal Code is hereby amended as follows:

7.09(16) RESERVED PARKING FOR OFFICIALS.

- (a) It is necessary that certain City, County, State and other public employees have reserved parking spaces for their vehicles in City parking lots and on certain city streets in order to allow efficient access to and from public buildings. Therefore, when a parking space in any City parking lot, or City street designated by a distinct sign indicating that the parking space in front of the sign is reserved parking for a City, County, State or other public employee or department, no person shall park or leave standing any vehicle in any part of the reserved space.
- (b) The following organizations shall have reserved parking spaces in the City parking lots in the Alma Waite Annex parking lot located north of the Municipal Building: (1802 04/11/95, 2033 11/14/2000, 2321 10/27/2009, 2564 10/27/2020)
 - (i) Fire Department ("For Fire Personnel Only") – nine (9) spaces.
 - (ii) Baraboo District Ambulance Service – ~~(8) eight~~ (10) ten spaces.

2. This Ordinance shall take effect upon passage and publication as provided by law.

Terms and Conditions

1. The initiation and accomplishment of the improvement will be subject to the applicable federal, state and local laws, administrative policy and program rules, ordinances, standards, and contract bidding requirements. Please note that if any portion of an improvement is funded using federal funds (including design, real estate, or other related work activities), the entire improvement will be subject to federal requirements. All components of the improvement must be defined in the environmental document if any portion of the project is federally funded.
2. The construction of the improvement will be in accordance with the appropriate standards unless an exception to standards is granted by the state prior to construction. The entire cost of the improvement not constructed to standards will be the responsibility of the Municipality/County unless such exception is granted.
3. The Municipality/County will assume all responsibility for complying with all applicable environmental requirements for the improvement.
4. The work, which is eligible for state participation will be administered by the Municipality/County. The authority for the state to delegate this responsibility is described in ch. Trans 206.
5. All contracts will be let by competitive bid and awarded to the lowest responsible bidder in accordance with the provisions of s.86.31 Wis. Stats. and all other municipal/county bidding requirements.
6. State financing will be limited to up to 50 percent (%) participation in eligible items or to the limit approved for the improvement - whichever is less
7. Payments to the Municipality/County will be made after the improvement is completed, and the contractor(s) fully reimbursed.
8. In order to guarantee the Municipality's foregoing agreements to pay the State, the Municipality, through its above duly authorized officers or officials, agrees and authorizes the State to set off and withhold the required reimbursement amount as determined by the State from any moneys otherwise due and payable by the State to the Municipality.
9. The Municipality/County will keep records of the cost of the improvement together with letting documents and will have them available for inspection by representatives of the state and will furnish copies when requested.
10. The design and construction of the improvement must be certified by a registered professional engineer, if the cost of the improvement exceeds \$65,000.
11. Federal Single Audits of Local Government Units:
 - a. The Municipality/County shall have a single organization audit performed by a qualified independent auditor if required to do so under federal law and regulations. (See Federal Circular No. A-133)
 - b. This audit shall be performed in accordance with Federal Circular A-133 issued by the Federal Office of Management and Budget (OMB) and state single audit guidelines issued by the Wisconsin Department of Administration (DOA).
 - c. The Municipality/County will keep records of costs of construction, inspection tests and maintenance done by it to enable the State to review the amount and nature of the expenditure for those purposes. Such accounting records and any other related records shall be subject to a project review or audit as directed by the Department within ten (10) years of project closing.
12. The Municipality/County will maintain, at its own cost and expense, all portions of the project that lie within its jurisdiction and will make ample provision of such maintenance as long as the road remains open to traffic.
13. This agreement is subject to the availability of State funds appropriated for this program. The continuance of this agreement beyond the limits of funds already available to the Wisconsin Department of Transportation is contingent upon appropriation of the necessary funds by the Wisconsin Legislature and the Governor. (Reference 66 OAG 408; State ex rel. LaFollette v. Reuter, 36 Wis. 2d 96, 119 [1967])
14. In accordance with the State's sunset policy for LRIP projects, the subject improvement must be constructed and submitted for reimbursement within three biennium.

Checking this box indicates that the Preparer is authorized to conduct official business for the Municipality/County identified below and upon acceptance by the State shall constitute agreement between the Municipality/County and the State, subject to the terms and conditions above.

Old Business:

West Baraboo agreements – We received another amended sewer agreement from WB. I will be meeting with our attorneys next week. After reviewing WB requested changes, I feel we took a step backwards.

New Business:

Review/Approve resolution for awarding private lead service replacements. (Bids are due 7/20 @ 9:00, as I write this, we have received no bids yet)

Reports:

Lead Services – We continue to work with local plumbers on replacing services.

Sewer Main Televising Project – The contractor has completed about 60% of the televising. Contractor is due here this week to continue the project.

Emergency Sewer Replacement – On Barker between 6th Street and 7th Street there was a 36” sewer main that started to collapse. Allen Steele Inc replaced the line with a 15” PVC line. We will schedule the paving of the street in conjunction with other street projects.

Hwy A water tower project – The project is moving along good. The interior painting is complete. Yesterday (7/19), the crew completed the sandblasting of the exterior. The tower is scheduled to back into service on 8/19. If weather cooperates, that date could get moved up.

Consolidation of Utilities – Mr. Bradley, Mr. Pinion and myself met with WB about consolidating utilities. It was a good conversation. We will see if it gains any traction.



JULY 2022 STREET DEPARTMENT STATUS REPORT

Staffing/Scheduling Updates

- Staff levels remain the same at 14.
- We are still operating with 7:00 start 5-days per week as our “normal” schedule. We have adjusted start time to an earlier start on days that the temps are expected to be very high, and we have utilized “4-10’s” when the schedule is advantageous to a specific task.

Activity Report

- **Alleys:** As of this meeting, the 2/3 Alley – Birch to West and 2/3 Alley – Center to Summit should be paved, shouldered, and topsoiled. Crews began the 5/6 Alley – Camp to Wheeler on Monday 7/18, and it will be pavement ready by 7/27, weather permitting. Remaining alley to be completed will be Vine to Quarry Alley, funding permitting.
- **Traffic Paint Striping:** Paint industry is again experiencing limited supply of traffic paint, primarily white. We ordered 30% more for 2022 than 2021 to “catch up” from the shortage last year, and are optimistic that we will be able to get everything completed before supplies run out.

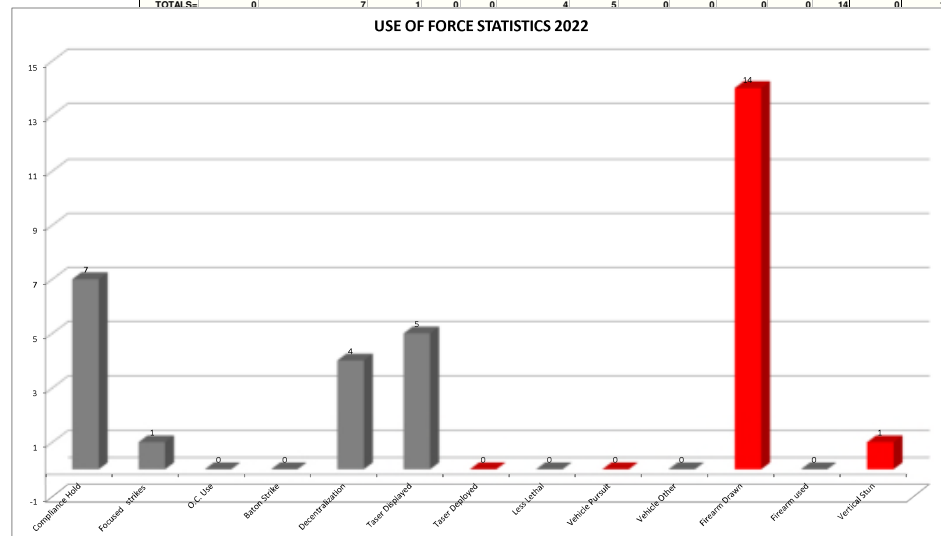
Project Updates

- **Equipment/Vehicle Purchases 2022:**
 - Our 2022 Bonnell Olympian Pro Automated Leaf Vac arrived two weeks ago. This 30 cu. yd. unit replaced a 2011 American Road Machinery manual unit.
 - Our 2022 Bobcat skidsteers arrived last week. They replaced two 2019 Bobcat skidsteers. Going forward, we intend to replace every two years at a minimum to always remain in factory warranty and maximize our trade value.

 - **Brush Collection:** Will have options/suggestions completed for August 2022 Public Safety Meeting. Factors we are considering are financial impact to budget (fuel, labor, outside services, and equipment repairs), efficiency of operations, safety of staff, and equipment wear and tear.
 - **Refuse/Recycling RFP:** Currently being reviewed by Casey and Tom. Update in near future.
